rd Rail Division of Sunset Models continues work on its project to offer both Y-6A and B versions of N&W big 2-8-8-2 articulated steam locomotives. The importer says the oscale brass models will be loaded with hundreds of separately applied parts including a fully detailed backhead with painted handles and dials.

Other special features include a fully lagged smoke box, sprung drivers and sprung tender trucks. This impressive model is expected to arrive this winter and will carry an equally impressive sticker price in the \$1800 range

Accurail (www.accurail.com) is offering a selection of HO scale car kits at the bargain price of \$7.79

including 55-ton twin- and 70-ton triple-hoppers, 40 and 50-foot steel boxcars, 40-foot wood boxcars and stock cars.

Bachmann has announced an **N scale** GE 44-ton switcher that comes DC-ready for speed, direction and lighting.

Additional features of the Spectrum series model include eight-wheel drive, a can motor, LED headlights, scale 33-inch wheels with NMRA wheel profile and a non-operating dummy knuckle coupler. We'll bring you details on road names and arrival dates as soon as they are available.




FIGURE 7: The Erie Lackawanna Historical Society (www.erielack.org), in conjunction with InterMountain Railway, is offering a unique HO scale model of a 40-foot DL&W series 53000-53259 boxcar with a combination of prototypically accurate sides, ends, door and roof that has not been previously issued by IMRC. The components include a 1937 10-panel riveted 10-foot car body, modern Dreadnaught ends, diagonal panel roof with a steel running board, 8-rung ladders and a 6-foot Youngstown 5-6-5 door from Southwest Scale Productions. Society members worked overtime with IMRC to insure that the distinctive lettering of the 1950s-era "Phoebe Snow" car be authentic. Two car numbers (53012 and 53215) are currently available. A 1940s-era "Route of Phoebe Snow" car will be introduced this fall.


The Santa Fe Railway Historical & Modeling Society (www.atsfrr.net/






FIGURE 10: Rapido (www.rapidotrains.com) will soon begin supplying dealers with quantities with two types of N scale passenger trucks: Type 1-BNO-11 four-wheel passenger trucks with outside swing hangers (above left) and Type 41-N-11 trucks with inside swing hangers (right). Both types will be equipped with insulated metal RP-25 wheelsets on an 8-foot 6-inch wheelbase. The trucks are cast from Celcon plastic with numerous added details separately-applied to both sides of each side frame. The trucks will carry a MSRP of \$7.95 a pair.




FIGURE 11: Republic Locomotive Works (www. republiclocomotiveworks.com) has completed work on a revised etched brass kit that makes into a five-car set of N scale San Juan passenger cars. Material is included to create the parlor car Alamosa, a second parlor car (either Chama or Durango), a coach (number 312, 323 or 327), a baggage/mail car (number 66 or 119), and a baggage car (number 111 or 127). The kit includes trucks, couplers, roofs and floors. The underbody details including the brake mechanism, marker lights, coal boxes, vents,

stoves, and stove pipes are white metal castings. Truss rods, grabirons and decals for all five cars are included. All development work in preparing what promises to be a challenging kit has been completed with the exception of the instructions which should be ready before the end of October.






FIGURE 13: Sergent Engineering (www.sergentengineering.com) is now offering HO scale AAR Lower

Intended primarily for use on tank cars, the double shelf coupler (right) limits the vertical movement of a mating coupler in a derailment and prevents it from riding up and puncturing the tank.




FIGURE 14: Precision Scale Company expects to deliver two versions of an HOn3 scale Shay by late December. The Michigan Cal version will be available in raw brass or painted and decorated as Michigan Cal No.

Briefly noted at press time...

... MRH has learned that Con-Cor will add an **HOn3** version to its forthcoming **HO scale** pre-war PCC street cars that are set for release late this fall. Officials from Con-Cor are expected to make a formal announcement of the new car during the National Narrow Gauge Convention to be held September 16-19 in Colorado Springs, Colorado.

Sources told MRH that both the standard and narrow gauge version of

the initial release will be decorated for the same transit lines, however, a final decision on what the roadnames will be has been delayed and probably won't be known for another 4 to 6 weeks.

. . . Richard Steele, owner of LaBelle Woodworking, Cheyenne, Wyoming, (www.labellemodels.com) has agreed to purchase the Red Ball Line of HO scale kits from Model Railroad Warehouse, (www.mrrwarehouse. com) a manufacturing and distribution firm with operations in Huntington and Roanoke, Indiana.

The pending sale will include the tooling, fixtures, art work and manufacturing rights to produce Red Ball kits. Steele is currently expanding his existing facility to accommodate the production of the Red Ball line. Model Railroad Warehouse, which has owned Red Ball since 1972, will retain all finished inventory and is expected to announce plans shortly for a major sale marking the 70th anniversary of Red Ball.






